

## Make-Up Supply and Instruction

Dear Dancers and Parents,

Below is the list of Make-Up that you will need for the **performance**. It is very important that dancers and parents learn how to apply make-up because it is part of being a dancer and performer. We also have a "Getting the Look" Sheet that has step by step instructions with pictures to guide all of you in how to put on stage Make-Up on-line. Please keep it with you as a reference.

Please practice before the performance if you are not familiar with applying make-up and if you are a veteran dancer please make sure you have all of these supplies and that they are **new** and not old from last year, which can carry infection.

I would go to the drugstore to purchase all of your Make-Up. Rite-Aid used to return make-up that wasn't the right color - they might still do that otherwise, stay in the low end costs. Stage Make-up is not for everyday wear and is not intended to look "natural". So don't spend a lot of money on the higher end make-up. "Wet and Wild", "Jane", "N.Y.C.", "Prestige" and "Cover Girl" are pretty reasonable and Target is a great source as well.

Here are your supplies:

<b>Make-Up Supplies</b>	<b>Helpful Hints</b>
1. Foundation	Foundation should match your child's skin color. Test on the inside of the jaw line to match. Foundation keeps the make-up from coming off while dancing and sweating under the lights)
2. Creamy White Shadow	To cover the whole eyelid as a base for shadow and to highlight the brow bone after brown/grey shadow is applied.
3. Brown or Grey Shadows in 2 shades (Light and Dark)	Brown shadow is for Brown/Green eyes and Grey Shadow is for Blue eyes. Make sure the pack comes in a dark and light shade. Dark Shade for the lid and ½ of (outer) crease and Light for blending and the inner crease.
4. Soft White Eyeliner Pencil (optional)	For under the inner eye at the tear duct and to open the eye.
5. Black Liquid Liner and or Smooth Sharp Black Pencil Liner	To line the lash line before and after shadow is applied. If you have a steady hand liquid works the best, if not, pencil is ok
6. Brown or Grey Pencil Liner	To line the under lash Line after Shadow is applied.
7. Super Black Mascara and Eyelash Curler	Curl the lashes at the of lash line and at the ½ way point and then apply 2-3 coats of Heavy Black Mascara ("Maybelline Great Lash" with the curved brush is the best)
8. Blush	Should be coral/peach (for olive/tan skin tones) or rosy pink (for fair skin).
9. Lip Stick and Lip Liner	Get a natural lip color that is several colors darker than your child's lips. The liner keeps the lipstick on longer. (Shades of Pink/and Red are preferred)
10. Pencil Sharpener (optional if needed)	Get a good eyeliner/brow liner pencil sharpener.
<b>*** Don't forget a simple make-up bag and don't share any eye Make-Up as you can pass "Pink Eye" or eye infections very easily.</b>
